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Reading Levels

Within the next few weeks, all children who are not yet 'free readers' will have taken a short benchmark assessment, which means they will read a short passage aloud to an adult and answer comprehension questions about what they have read. This will help us to choose the correct level book for them so that the texts they bring home are just right in terms of challenge and new vocabulary. This chart shows the order of the book levels at CCJ.

0 Lilac	9 Gold
1 Pink	10 White
2 Red	11 Lime
3 Yellow	12 Brown
4 Blue	13 Grey
5 Green	14 Navy
6 Orange	15 Burgundy
7 Turquoise	16 Black
8 Purple	

Year 3 parents should note that the reading scheme at the Infants goes up to lime level, after which children are 'free readers'. As our reading scheme has more levels, some children who were previously free readers at CCI will now have a levelled reading book again. Although expression and pronunciation are extremely important, children will also need to have a good comprehension of events, the characters and the themes to move up to the next level.

Our reading books can be found in the 'Reading Hub' in the middle of the school, right next to our library, where there is a new display showing all the reading levels. Children also have the opportunity to choose a book from our extensive selection of library books to take home and read in addition to their levelled text.

If your child is a free reader, we will be developing a new scheme over the next few months so that they have regular access to high quality texts - watch this space! In the meantime, please encourage them to use our wonderful library to choose a good read.

As part of our weekly homework, all children should read their levelled reading book (or library book if they are a free reader) at least five times a week. Every child has a yellow reading record to note when they have read and to keep a track of which books they have already read.

Comprehension is a very important part of learning to read so it is important to ask your child lots of questions about their book to help them progress to the next level. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's book level, please speak to their class teacher, who will be able to discuss your child's next steps.


House Cup This week Team Phoenix have won the house cup.
