

Strategy of the Week: Mnemonics

This is a polite reminder about uniforms.

Boys: Grey/black shorts or trousers, white, light blue or navy shirt/polo shirt, navy sweater/sweatshirt (No hoodies*), grey, white, black or dark blue socks and plain black shoes (no logo or colour).

Girls: Grey/black shorts or trousers (NOT leggings), knee length skirt, blue/white print dress or grey pinafore dress. white, light blue or navy blouse/polo shirt, navy cardigan/sweater/sweatshirt (no hoodies* or fashion cardigans), plain grey, white, black or dark blue tights/socks and plain black shoes not sandals (no logo or colour). Hair bands and clips should be blue, black or white only.
