Taekwondo

Christchurch Junior School has become the first school in the region to help launch an exciting new martial arts and fitness programme in schools called 'Schools & Colleges Taekwondo' which runs every Monday morning at 8.00am and is already extremely popular. The programme was the brainchild of Taekwondo instructor Andy Davies who was recently presented with the new 'British Citizens Medal' at an investiture ceremony in the Palace of Westminster for services to education. Andy is the national president and coaching director of UK Chung Do Kwan. He is also Chief Instructor to the Elite Martial Arts & Fitness Gym in Hayward Road, Staple Hill which trains national and international competitors. This year the British UK Chung Do Kwan Championships are being held at the Keynsham Leisure Centre on Saturday 18th February which attracts competitors from all over the UK as well as from abroad. Pupils and their families from Christchurch School are invited to come along and watch.
