## E-Safety Reporting

At CCJ we love using technology to enhance learning and to broaden pupil's horizons! We also understand the importance of e-safety for our pupils, family and community. We have strict filtering systems and policies in place to protect our pupils online as far as possible. Despite this, we understand that using digital devices and the web is never 100% safe. To help support you with keeping your child safe online, we have recently updated our e-safety page on the school website. All contact forms will be kept confidential and will be responded to as soon as possible. ## Lower Band Doors from Term 2

As the weather starts to get colder and following parent feedback, we are making some changes to the way children in Lower Band come into the building at the start of the day. From Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> October, children will no longer need to line up every morning. From 8:45 onwards, children in 3SG, 3DK and 34AD will be able to enter the building through the Lower Band cloakroom door as soon as they arrive. Mr Desmond will be there at the door, which will be open until 8:55. Children in 4GE and 4RH should enter the building through the door at the end of their corridor. Any children arriving after the bell at 8:55 will need to report to reception. We look forward to welcoming everyone back next term - have a great half-term break!
